

HOW TO PROTECT YOUR ENTIRE VEHICLE

— FROM TERRITORIAL BIRDS —

Territorial birds react to reflections and return to the same spots again and again. Match coverage to bird activity and eliminate the places they target.



CHOOSE THE RIGHT LEVEL OF COVERAGE

1

TARGETED PROTECTION



Focus on the most common target: side mirrors.

BEST FOR:
Occasional bird visits or seasonal activity.

2

EXPANDED COVERAGE



Add side windows to block more reflections and reduce territorial triggers.

BEST FOR:
Daily bird activity or multiple landing locations.

FULL SIDE COVERAGE



Protect all side windows and mirrors for the broadest coverage and best results.

BEST FOR:
Persistent birds, heavy pressure, or vehicles parked near trees, feeders, or nesting areas.

ADDITIONAL REFLECTION AREAS



Door handles and glossy trim can create strong reflections and attract attention—especially on dark-colored vehicles.

CONSIDER WHEN:
Birds continue to investigate after mirrors and windows are protected.

WHY COVERAGE MATTERS



Birds see reflections, not objects.



They return to the same spots repeatedly.



Habituation makes scare tactics less effective.



Prevent access and perching for long-term success.
